Family Center Opens



Supporting hope and healing for the whole family with comprehensive care is the goal for the Family Center officially opened by Children's Advantage this summer.

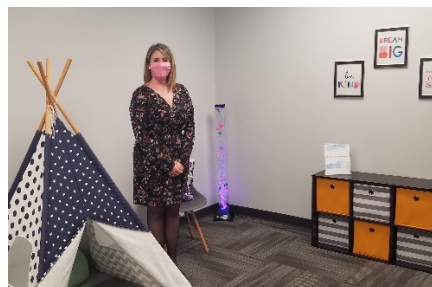
Children's Advantage has provided behavior health services for children and families for over 45 years with their primary headquarters on North Chestnut Street in Ravenna. Now, with their new 7,000 square foot facility located on 5968 New Milford Rd in Ravenna, they can expand their services.

"We saw the need to expand our services to treat the whole family rather than just focusing on the children," CEO Kathy Regal explained. "With the drug epidemic in the community, we have seen so many children being removed from their natural families -- children who were losing their parents through the drug epidemic. We started talking about a model of care to treat the whole family, and we developed the Family Center to do just that, to really look at the intergenerational trauma, the intergenerational poverty issues that affect the whole family."

Along with counseling offices, the center has group therapy rooms with comfortable seating and a full kitchen for families to build meal planning, budgeting, and meal preparation skills. The center also includes a sensory room where children can be observed during play therapy through a one-way mirror.

"We are learning more and more about the impact of traumatic events and the importance of providing evidence-based trauma treatment to help children and families cope and move toward recovery," commented John Garrity, PhD, executive director of the Mental Health & Recovery Board. "This new space will allow Children's Advantage to provide counseling, parenting, and kinship programs as well as some youth after-school programming."

The Family Center cost around \$600,000 to acquire and renovate and was paid for with help from a \$367,000 grant from the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services and \$122,500 from the Mental Health and Recovery Board of Portage County. Suicide Prevention Awareness

A message from the Portage County Suicide Prevention Coalition:

For the past several years, the number of Portage County residents dying by suicide has increased.

Suicide is complicated and tragic. There is no single cause of suicide - it is the outcome of multiple contributing factors and events. However, suicide is also preventable. Environmental factors such as access to lethal means increase the risk for suicide.

Safe storage of firearms to prevent suicide is an important part of suicide prevention. Lock your firearm and limit access to the keys and combination. Never allow children and teens to have unsupervised access.

If someone is in crisis, remove the gun and ammunition for now. Without a gun, less than 5% of suicide attempts result in death. But with a gun, 85% of attempts are fatal.

In a moment of crisis, access to a gun is the difference between life and death.

Free gun locks are available at the Portage County Health District and the Aurora, Brimfield, Garrettsville, Hiram, Kent, Ravenna, and Streetsboro Police Departments.

A person may be at risk for suicide after experiencing a death of a loved one, an end of a relationship, or a job loss. Some warning signs individuals display include talking about wanting to die, feeling hopeless, behaving recklessly, increasing alcohol or drug use, and withdrawing and isolating themselves.

September is National Suicide Awareness Month. Reach out to friends and family. Let them know you care and support them. If you know they have guns in their home, share this message regarding the importance of safe storage.
